I am a product of campus activity. I got saved at the now Government Technical College, Ijebu Ode, then Government Trade Centre. On the campus there, I got saved through the activities that the Apostolic Faith Church was having on the campus. They would come from the church, some with the Association of Visiting Secretaries (AVS), during the week for Bible study, and then on Sunday, we would have a group of ministers.

They used to come from No. 7 Moligba Road at the Apostolic Faith Church to that trade centre. It was during that time that I prayed through to the genuine experience of salvation. And I can testify that the older I become—am I getting old? Yes, to some extent, for this purpose. I can tell you, the older I become, the sweeter this gospel grows to me and for me. I got saved when I was only 18 years old, on December 1, 1974. It was on a Sunday when I got saved.

The Living Water

The woman at the well in Samaria received of that living water. We read in John 4:10-14 that Jesus was sitting at the well when she approached to draw water, and He asked her for a drink. She expressed amazement at His request because the Jews had no dealings with the Samaritans. Jesus told her, "If thou knewest the gift of God, and who it is that saith to thee, Give me to drink; thou wouldest have asked of him, and he would have given thee living water." The woman responded that He had nothing to draw with and the well was deep. She asked, "From whence then hast thou that living water?" Jesus replied, "Whosoever drinketh of this water shall thirst again: but whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life."

Jesus' words help us understand some facts about living water. First, we notice that Jesus told the woman, "If thou knewest the gift of God, . . ." so living water is a gift; it is freely offered. We see that it is living; it is not lifeless or stagnant. The Samaritan woman wanted something that would quench her thirst temporarily, but Jesus had in mind something that would satisfy her soul eternally!

The water that Jesus offered the Samaritan woman is available for us as well, and hopefully, our response is the same as hers. She said, "Sir, give me this water." We do not need a bucket to obtain what Jesus offers because it is spiritual water. Since it springs up within us, it is invisible to others and even to ourselves, but we can see its effects.

I could pour my heart out to God about everything weighing me down, and I never left the same way I came. Each time, I walked away filled with joy and happiness. Gradually, I started finding joy in serving—helping to arrange the fellowship hall, cleaning up, and contributing in any way I could. No matter how small my efforts seemed, I always held on to them as a point of faith to ask God for help when I needed Him. And God never disappointed. Whenever we gathered to pray for anyone who was sick, healing always followed—sometimes within hours or by the next day. It was then I knew I wasn't going back. AFCF gave me Jesus, drew me closer to Him, made my life complete, and provided me with a family I never thought I'd have on campus.
